# 2. Encouraging and Supportive Parents or Spouse

The success or failure of our children in music lessons or any other endeavor will be in direct proportion to the amount of interest, support, reward, and encouragement we give them. The study of music is a journey that will reap a lifetime of rewards and benefits. Encouragement and praise are the helium of life. As parents, we are musical encouragers for our children. Parents are an integral part of the musical team. It takes teamwork to make the musical dream work. Don't give up! Decisions we make now as parents, will affect our children's entire lives. No education is complete without the study of music. The opportunity to study and make music is one of the most valuable gifts we can give our children…a gift that will last a lifetime.

# 3. Willing Student

A beginning student of music does not necessarily have to be talented or gifted. It's not the aptitude of the student, but the attitude. Where there is a will, there is a way. If an instrument does not feel or sound right, unnecessary frustration may spread to disenchantment with music in general. Children take great pride in their pianos and become attached to them. A good piano reinforces the value of piano lessons and encourages a child to succeed. The very appearance of a poorly maintained piano can be discouraging to a child. When you buy a good piano, your child will be able to enjoy it throughout his or her lifetime. In order for a beginning piano student to develop a beautiful tone, even touch, balanced dynamics, clear pedaling, and a solid technique, a quality piano or a digital piano with a weighted hammer action is recommended. Keyboards are discouraging and not recommended because of limitations in key size, key dip, pedal options, and a non weighted touch. Imagine taking tennis lessons with a ping pong paddle! There are few things more discouraging than practicing on an inadequate instrument. The point is clear: If your child is to learn to play an instrument and be successful, he must begin on a good instrument. The end depends upon the beginning.

#### 5. Participation from Other Family Members in Piano Lessons

Piano lessons are not just for kids! Many adults are discovering the benefits of music study. Piano lessons are the perfect prescription for wellness of mind, body, and soul. Besides being fun and relaxing, learning to play the piano is the perfect stress reliever. There is a hidden talent hiding inside each and every one of us.
